Optional Discussion Questions:

- **1.** What did you hear in the video that was new or that stirred up questions for you?
- **2.** Do you have a favorite gospel that you gravitate toward? Why?
- **3.** How does recognizing that each gospel has a unique way of depicting Jesus' biography influence how we read the gospels (if at all)?
- **4.** Cyndi stated that the geography influences how Jesus communicated with people a fact not always obvious to the reader. How much (if at all) do you think that should change the way we read the stories of Jesus?

Optional Reading:

Read Mark and John (both can be read from beginning to end in one hour).

- Each gospel writer has a different perspective. Many scholars think Matthew, Mark, and Luke shared similar stories and experiences. Their gospels sound similar and often use the exact same words/phrases. John is completely different.
- Try to get a sense of the style of these gospels. How do they differ?
- What do you think it means to follow Jesus? Describe the types of people who followed him.
