

I will abundantly bless its provisions;


I will satisfy its poor with bread.

The Word of God

Old Testament reading: Numbers 11:10-30

¹⁰Moses heard the people weeping throughout their families, all at the entrances of their tents. Then the Lord became very angry, and Moses was displeased. ¹¹So Moses said to the Lord, "Why have you treated your servant so badly? Why have I not found favor in your sight, that you lay the burden of all this people on me? ¹²Did I conceive all this people? Did I give birth to them, that you should say to me, 'Carry them in your bosom, as a nurse carries a sucking child,' to the land that you promised on oath to their ancestors? ¹³Where am I to get meat to give to all this people? For they come weeping to me and say, 'Give us meat to eat!' ¹⁴I am not able to carry all this people alone, for they are too heavy for me. ¹⁵If this is the way you are going to treat me, put me to death at once—if I have found favor in your sight—and do not let me see my misery."

¹⁶So the Lord said to Moses, "Gather for me seventy of the elders of Israel, whom you know to be the elders of the people and officers over them; bring them to the tent of meeting, and have them take

their place there with you. ¹⁷I will come down and talk with you there; and I will take some of the spirit that is on you and put it on them; and they shall bear the burden of the people along with you so that you will not bear it all by yourself. ¹⁸And say to the people: Consecrate yourselves for tomorrow, and you shall eat meat; for you have wailed in the hearing of the Lord, saying, 'If only we had meat to eat! Surely it was better for us in Egypt.' Therefore the Lord will give you meat, and you shall eat. ¹⁹You shall eat not only one day, or two days, or five days, or ten days, or twenty days, ²⁰but for a whole month—until it comes out of your nostrils and becomes loathsome to you—because you have rejected the Lord who is among you, and have wailed before him, saying, 'Why did we ever leave Egypt?'" ²¹But Moses said, "The people I am with number six hundred thousand on foot; and you say, 'I will give them meat, that they may eat for a whole month'! ²² Are there enough flocks and herds to slaughter for them? Are there enough fish in the sea to catch for them?" ²³The Lord said to Moses, "Is the Lord's power limited? Now you shall see whether my word will come true for you or not."

²⁴So Moses went out and told the people the words of the Lord; and he gathered seventy elders of the people, and placed them all around the tent. ²⁵Then the Lord came down in the cloud and spoke to him, and took some of the spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders; and when the spirit rested upon them, they prophesied. But they did not do so again. ²⁶Two men remained in the camp, one named Eldad, and the other named Medad, and the spirit rested on them; they were among those registered, but they had not gone out to the tent, and so they prophesied in the camp. ²⁷And a young man ran and told Moses, "Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp." 28 And Joshua son of Nun, the assistant of Moses, one of his chosen men, said, "My lord Moses, stop them!" ²⁹But Moses said to him, "Are you jealous for my sake? Would that all the Lord's people were prophets, and that the Lord would put his spirit on them!" 30 And Moses and the elders of Israel returned to the camp.

This is the Word of the Lord.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John. *All* Glory to you, O Lord.

¹⁹When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁰After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. ²¹Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." ²²When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

The Ordination and Installation of Elders and Deacons

The minister introduces the candidates, explains the calling of elders and deacons, and then addresses the candidates.

Minister (to the candidates):

Brothers and sisters, before almighty God, and in the presence of this congregation, answer sincerely these questions:

Do you confess together with us and the church throughout the ages your faith in one God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?

Candidate: Yes, truly, with all my heart.

Minister (to the congregation):

Let us all stand with these brothers and sisters, confessing our faith in the words of the Apostles' Creed.

All I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The congregation is seated.

Minister (to the candidates):

Do you believe in your heart that you are called by Christ's church, and therefore by God, to this office?

Candidate: Yes, truly, with all my heart.

Minister:

Do you believe the books of the Old and New Testaments to be the Word of God and the perfect doctrine of salvation,

rejecting all contrary beliefs?

Candidate: Yes, truly, with all my heart.

Minister:

Will you be diligent in your study of Holy Scripture and in your use of the means of grace?
Will you pray for God's people and lead them by your own example in faithful service and holy living?

Candidate: I will, and I ask God to help me.

Minister:

Will you accept the church's order and governance, submitting to ecclesiastical discipline should you become delinquent in either life or doctrine?

Candidate: I will, and I ask God to help me.

Minister:

Will you be loyal to the witness and work of the Reformed Church in America, using all your abilities to further its Christian mission here and throughout the world?

Candidate: I will, and I ask God to help me.

Minister (to the candidates for the Office of Deacon):

As deacons, will you faithfully, diligently, and cheerfully manifest Christ's love and care, gather and distribute the offerings of God's people, visit and comfort the distressed, minister to the poor and needy, and strive to advance God's reign of justice and peace?

Candidate: I will, and I ask God to help me.

Minister (to the candidates for the Office of Elder):

As elders, will you faithfully, diligently, and cheerfully study God's Word, oversee the household of faith, encourage spiritual growth, maintain loving discipline, and provide for the proclamation of the gospel and celebration of the sacraments?

Candidate: I will, and I ask God to help me.

Those to be ordained shall kneel for prayer with the laying on of hands.

The minister gives the declaration of ordination and pastoral charge.

Minister (to the congregation):

Members of City Church, please rise to affirm your covenant with the elders and deacons whom God has given us.

Beloved in Jesus Christ, do you receive in the name of the Lord, these deacons and elders as duly elected and ordained servants of Christ?

Congregation: We do.

Minister:

Do you promise to respect them for the sake of the offices for which they have been chosen and ordained?

Congregation: We do.

Minister:

Do you promise to encourage and pray for them, to labor together in obedience to the gospel for the unity, purity, and peace of the church, the welfare of the whole world, and the honor of our Lord Jesus Christ?

Congregation: We do.

Minister:

Beloved people of God, receive these deacons and elders as Christ's own servants. Support them in love, that their work may bear fruit.

In the name and by the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ, I declare that these brothers and sisters are duly installed deacons and elders in this church.

All Thanks be to God.

that the whole world may know true peace.

All Lord, hear our prayer.

Give grace to all who proclaim the gospel through Word and sacrament and deeds of mercy, that by teaching and example others may come to live for you. For this, O Lord, we pray:

All Lord, hear our prayer.

Comfort and deliver, O Lord, all who are in trouble, sorrow, poverty, sickness, and grief.
Heal them in body, mind, spirit, or circumstance, working in them, by your grace, wonders beyond their dreams and hopes, through Jesus Christ our Savior.
For this, O Lord, we pray:

All Lord, hear our prayer.

Now gathering our prayers into one, let us pray boldly as our Savior has taught us:

All Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.
 Give us this day our daily bread.
 And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors.
 And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
 For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.


GOD STRENGTHENS US AT HIS TABLE
