
## Reading

Grace, mercy, and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you.



#### All Lord, have mercy.





In the public reading of the word of God and its exposition in the sermon, God shares the story of his saving mission in Jesus, encouraging us to join in that mission and orienting us again to his priorities.

#### The Word of God

Old Testament reading: Habakkuk 1:2-11

<sup>2</sup>O Lord, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not listen? Or cry to you "Violence!" and you will not save? <sup>3</sup>Why do you make me see wrong-doing and look at trouble? Destruction and violence are before me; strife and contention arise. <sup>4</sup>So the law becomes slack and justice never prevails. The wicked surround the righteous—therefore judgment comes forth perverted.

<sup>5</sup>Look at the nations, and see! Be astonished! Be astounded! For a work is being done in your days that you would not believe if you were told. <sup>6</sup>For I am rousing the Chaldeans, that fierce and impetuous nation, who march through the breadth of the earth to seize dwellings not their own. <sup>7</sup>Dread and fearsome are they; their justice and dignity proceed from themselves. <sup>8</sup>Their horses are swifter than leopards, more menacing than wolves at dusk; their horses charge. Their horsemen come from far away; they fly like an eagle swift to devour. <sup>9</sup>They all come for violence, with faces pressing forward; they gather captives like sand. <sup>10</sup>At kings they scoff, and of rulers they make sport. They laugh at every fortress, and heap up earth to take it. <sup>11</sup>Then they sweep by like the wind; they transgress and become guilty; their own might is their god!

This is the Word of the Lord.

Gospel reading: Luke 21:25-28

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

<sup>25</sup>"There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. <sup>26</sup>People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. <sup>27</sup>Then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in a cloud' with power and great glory. <sup>28</sup>Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near."

All It is right to give thanks and praise.


## The Eucharistic Prayer


