

Opening of Worship


Grace, mercy, and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you.



GOD SPEAKS TO US IN HIS WORD

In the public reading of the word of God and its exposition in the sermon, God shares the story of his saving mission in Jesus, encouraging us to join in that mission and orienting us again to his priorities.

The Word of God

Old Testament reading: Habakkuk 1:12-2:3

¹²Are you not from of old, O Lord my God, my Holy One? You shall not die. O Lord, you have marked them for judgment; and you, O Rock, have established them for punishment. ¹³Your eyes are too pure to behold evil, and you cannot look on wrongdoing; why do you look on the treacherous, and are silent when the wicked swallow those more righteous than they? ¹⁴You have made people like the fish of the sea, like crawling things that have no ruler. ¹⁵The enemy brings all of them up with a hook; he drags them out with his net, he gathers them in his seine; so he rejoices and exults. ¹⁶Therefore he sacrifices to his net and makes offerings to his seine; for by them his portion is lavish, and his food is rich. ¹⁷Is he then to keep on emptying his net, and destroying nations without mercy?

¹I will stand at my watchpost, and station myself on the rampart; I will keep watch to see what he will say to me, and what he will answer concerning my complaint. ²Then the Lord answered me and said: Write the vision; make it plain on tablets, so that a runner may read it. ³For there is still a vision for the appointed time; it speaks of the end, and does not lie. If it seems to tarry, wait for it; it will surely come, it will not delay.

Gospel reading: Luke 3:1a, 2b-6

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. *All* Glory to you, O Lord.

¹For fifteen years, Emperor Tiberius had ruled that part of the world...²During this time, John, the son of Zechariah, was living in the desert, and he received a message from God. ³So John went along the Jordan Valley and told the people God's message. He told them, "Turn back to God and be baptized! Then your sins will be forgiven." ⁴This is like the words written in the book of Isaiah the prophet:

"In the desert someone is shouting,

'Get the road ready for the Lord! Make a straight path for him. ⁵Every valley will be filled, and every mountain and hill will be made

flat.

Crooked roads will be made straight, and rough roads will be made smooth.

⁶Then everyone will see how God will save his people!"

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

The Eucharistic Prayer




